

MATCH REVIEW PANEL

THURSDAY 13 JUNE 2024

On Thursday 13 June 2024, the Football Queensland Match Review Panel (MRP) convened to consider two incidents arising from Round 14 of the NPL Men & FQPL 1 Men competitions.

Wynnum Wolves vs Rochedale Rovers - Andrew Thompson (Rochedale Rovers)

The MRP considered an incident involving Andrew Thompson of Rochedale Rovers on or around the 91st minute of Rochedale's NPL Men match against Wynnum Wolves on Friday 7 June 2024.

In accordance with the Football Queensland Disciplinary Regulations (the **Regulations**), the MRP has the authority to consider the incident as Thompson was issued with a Red Card by the Referee.

The MRP determined that Thompson committed the offence of 'R8 04-01 Use offensive, insulting or abusive language or gestures towards a Match Official (isolated incident)'. The minimum sanction for the offence is four (4) matches, being the Mandatory Match Suspension plus three (3) additional matches.

The MRP confirmed that Thompson will serve a suspension of four (4) matches, being the minimum sanction for the offence. The MRP would like to remind participants in the Professional Leagues that abusive language towards the Match Officials will not be tolerated at any time.

Capalaba FC vs Ipswich FC - Assante Attilio (Capalaba FC)

The MRP considered an incident involving Assante Attilio of Capalaba FC on or around the 21st minute of Capalaba's FQPL 1 Men match against Ipswich FC on Saturday 8 June 2024.

In accordance with the Football Queensland Disciplinary Regulations (the **Regulations**), the MRP has the authority to consider the incident as Attilio was issued with a Red Card by the Referee.

The MRP determined that Attilio committed the offence of 'R1 02-01 Attempting to gain possession of the ball using excessive force'. The minimum sanction for the offence is two (2) matches, being the Mandatory Match Suspension plus one (1) additional match.

The MRP confirmed that Attilio will serve a suspension of two (2) matches, being the minimum sanction for the offence.
